I. Historical note.

The New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary was established in 1917 as the Baptist Bible Institute. In 1946 the name was changed to New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. The seminary is owned by the Southern Baptist Convention who elects its trustees. The seminary is a coeducational institution to train Christian pastors, missionaries, musicians, religious educators and others in Christian ministry. II. Scope and Content.

This is an artificial collection of various material on New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. The collection consists primarily of seminary bulletins/catalogs and directories from 1918 to present. The collection also includes copies of scattered special event bulletins and informational brochures on the seminary and its degree programs. The collection includes 3 linear ft. of material. Additions are expected for the collection, therefore the folders are not numbered.

The collection covers the years from 1918 and consists of 2.5 linear ft. of material. The collection is divided into two series: I. Bulletins and directories and II. Other material.
