

#### **Summary**

#### **Historical Sketch**

Early in the 19<sup>th</sup> century, Elder Moore Stevenson, a Baptist from Sumner County (Tenn.), began preaching at what was known as Koonce's Meeting House, located near Leeville. He with the help of Patrick Mooney, from Station Camp and others, joined together to constitute Big Cedar Lick, the first Baptist church in Wilson County, April 25, 1801. Big Cedar Lick Church belonged to the Mero District Association, the first association of Baptist churches in Middle Tennessee.

A new frame building was built in 1810. By the year 1843, the name had been changed from Big Cedar Lick to Mt. Olivet. The first Sunday School was organized April, 1868. The Woman's Missionary Union was formed in 1889 with the Baptist Young People's Union in 1925.

The church celebrated its  $175^{th}$  anniversary in 1976 and published an extensive history. The church held a celebration event in 2001 on the occasion of its  $200^{th}$  anniversary.

#### **Scope and Content Note**

The Mt. Olivet Baptist Church Collection consists of .5 linear ft. of material. The small collection includes Sunday school and Vacation Bible school attendance award posters, picture lesson cards from children's Sunday school, anniversary programs, church membership letter, Baptist publications, Sunday school curriculum, and a Sunday school record book for the church.

The SBHLA also holds two published histories of the church and the records of the congregation from 1801-1976 on microfilm (MF 4286).
